Don't forget to cross the road to visit the duck pond, filled with bird life.

Follow the river past the car park, taking in the fantastic view of Truro and the cathedral spires at the head of the river. Follow the path south to Sunny Corner and continue the loop back to the park.

## Boscawen Park Loop

Boscawen Park is Truro's play, sports and activity

hub. Here you will find tennis, football, Truro's

canoe club, a fantastic children's playground and

refreshments, all set in beautifully maintained

parkland and gardens.



The route begins by following the river to Newham Quays where dynamite was once exported. The walk joins the path along the old track bed of the Newham railway line which has now been recolonised by wildlife. The trail eventually emerges beside County Hall at Highertown, where you can return via the A391, the city or retrace your route back along the trail for a different view!

This trail follows the old Newham Railway track bed, which runs from Gas Hill, Newham to New County Hall. The trail is approximately 1.6 miles of easy and safe off-road walking and cycling.

Historically this was a train route which formed the branch line to Falmouth, carrying goods such as timber from the industrial yards and docks at Newham.

## The Truro River Future Loop

This loop follows the western and eastern banks of the river from Newham, along Morlaix Avenue and back along Malpas Road to Boscawen Park.

Watch this space... A new pedestrian bridge is proposed to complete the loop and will connect the Newham side of the river to Boscawen Park.

When the tide is low, look out for wading birds, including the **Black-tailed Godwit**, which comes to feed on the mud flats. At high tide canoeists, sailors and paddle boarders take to the water.

## Moresk Forest Loop

This is where Truro's rivers and countryside meet. Follow Malpas Road from Boscawen Park to Malpas Village where you will be rewarded with stunning views across the river to the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

The famous Cornish love story of **Tristan and Iseult** tells how Iseult crossed the Truro river at La Mal Pas, the early name for today's Malpas!

From here, take the permissive paths through the beautiful forest and complete the loop back to Boscawen Park.
